Did You Know

According to the U.S. Department of State; Texas is number 2 of the top 5 adopting states. In 2011, the total number of adoptions in Texas was 570; 324 being females and 246 being male.

Myth: Only rich people can afford to adopt.

Truth: While you can expect certain costs associated with adoptions, we work to keep these numbers as reasonable as possible. As well, we offer adoptive parents a detailed estimate of costs upfront so that you can plan accordingly.

Myth: Closed adoptions are the best option.

Fact: In the past, many domestic adoptions were closed and adopted children often had no idea about their family origin. Now, the process has changed. We promote open and semi-open adoption, which allows for some contact and exchange of information to help build a legacy for each adopted child.
